Message from Andrea Abbott-Kokosin, Executive Director

The summer months were very busy at Wendat. Tag Days held in May raised \$2,718. September Tag Days are scheduled for September 20th and 21st and will be the last time Wendat does tagging as we are focusing our volunteer and staffing resources on other fundraising opportunities.

The 15th Annual Boston Pizza Wendat Charity Golf Scramble took place on Monday June 24th and raised \$42,581. With this funding, we replaced one of our older vans and added another to the fleet. Wendat now has 4 vans (Boston Pizza Bullets) on the road transporting clients to our programs.

The 16th annual SEGBay Chamber of Commerce Golf Tournament took place on August 13th. Wendat will receive \$12,000 from this event.

I am pleased to announce that Wendat is now partnering with the OPP to provide a mobile mental health response team. You can read more about this on page 5.

We are excited to be selected as one of the recipients of funding from the Tiny Mayor's Golf Tournament being held on September 13th, 2019 and anticipate that we will receive \$2,500 from that event.

Welcome Dr. Laurie Wells!

Wendat is excited to announce that Dr. Laurie Wells moved her parttime private practice to Wendat Community Programs effective July 2nd, 2019. Dr. Wells is a Family Doctor and psychotherapist. She has focused her practice, "Own Health", on comprehensive ways to improve mental health. She will continue her work at Waypoint, as lead for the Metabolic Program at Outpatients on Mondays, and is teaching at McMaster Medical School on Tuesdays until December.

Laurie is renting office space from Wendat. In addition, Laurie and Wendat have a collaborative agreement. As she is able to take on new patients, Laurie will make Wendat clients a priority. She plans to provide both individual and group counselling and psychotherapy, and to continue to work with Wendat staff in the development and delivery of mental health programs. In addition, she will work with the management team to develop and deliver a continuous plan for "indirect" psychiatric services for the community mental health services at Wendat.

Ontario Health Teams

The Ontario government is building a connected health care system centred around patients, families and caregivers. These changes will strengthen local services, making it easier for patients to navigate the system and transition between providers. Ontario Health Teams are being introduced to provide a new way of organizing and delivering care that is more connected to patients in their local communities. Under Ontario Health Teams, health care providers (including hospitals, doctors and home and community care providers) will work as one coordinated team - no matter where they provide care.

Wendat Community Programs is actively participating in local efforts to submit an application for a North Simcoe Ontario Health Team in collaboration with partner organizations. We will keep you all up to date on our progress.

Meet the NS CMART Team!

Provincial Constable Jeff Dorion from the Southern Georgian Bay OPP detachment and Crisis Worker Teesha Gaudet BSW/RSW from Wendat Community Programs.



The Southern Georgian Bay detachment of the OPP and Wendat Community Programs have partnered together to create the North Simcoe Crisis Management and Resource Team (CMART). The CMART's mandate: to assist those who are experiencing a mental health crisis, via initial crisis response or by directing them to the appropriate services that will facilitate ongoing treatment, support and stabilization in the community.

This partnership began on April 1, 2019. CMART is possible by funding to Wendat from the North Simcoe Muskoka LHIN with additional funding from the town of Midland, Town of Penetanguishene, Tiny Township and Tay Township.

The CMART team is comprised of Provincial Constable Jeff Dorion from the Southern Georgian Bay OPP detachment and Crisis Worker Teesha Gaudet BSW/RSW from Wendat Community Programs. The two work together to assist in the response to incidents reported to police involving a mental health component. The purpose of this partnership is to help reduce emergency room visits and repeated calls for police involvement.

"Wendat has always worked closely with Midland Police and now OPP and we are so pleased to formalize this partnership. Providing treatment and care in the community for mental health crisis, it is a win win for the OPP, the hospital, Mental Health Service providers, it is good for everyone," said Andrea Abbott-Kokosin, Executive Director at Wendat.

"The CMART assists community members when they are in crisis and more importantly following a crisis; reducing the cyclical effect of police calls for service and hospital emergency department visits. The benefits to this program are very far reaching" said Staff Sergeant Lee Jeannotte of the Southern Georgian Bay OPP detachment.

Since the program became operational the team has responded to a number of people experiencing a crisis. In addition to initial response, the team continues to assist those in need through visits, phone calls and referrals to help prevent and divert repeat calls to frontline officers when community programs may be a better fit for the individual. The follow-up conducted by the team during the pilot project has reduced hospital visits and the expectation would be for that trend to continue.





Seniors' Support Services Programs News

Assisted Living Program Submitted by: Kathy Jolie, Program Supervisor

Many of the residents living in the Lorna Tomlinson Residence for Seniors are provided with support from Wendat's Assisted Living Program. Assistance with laundry, light housekeeping, bathing and medication reminders provide our residents with the support needed to remain in their own homes longer. A small amount of support to a frail senior can reduce the number of hospital admissions as well as Long Term Care admissions.

Staff of the Assisted Living Program are able to provide support to the residents in the areas of nutrition and exercise, managing chronic illnesses such as diabetes and COPD and will assist the residents in logging their monthly blood pressures and weights. Should an issue be identified, the resident would be directed to their family physician for follow-up.

Adult Day Program and Congregate Dining Submitted by: Kathy Jolie, Program Supervisor

At the Day Program we offer a variety of activities to stimulate minds and bodies. The VON SMART Exercise Program is held regularly. The program is offered to our residents as well as seniors living in the local community. The day program also offers plenty of activities, games and crafts to help the clients keep busy. One such activity is the wonderful singing and guitar playing of Roy Stevenson who comes twice a month to entertain us all with his songs from the past. There are often guest facilitators providing diverse cultural, recreational and social activities.

The program is held four days per week Monday to Thursday. We welcome new members.

The congregate dining program provides meals three times a day for the residents of the Lorna Tomlinson Residence as well as lunch Monday to Thursday for the participants in the Day Program. Our dedicated team of full time and part time cooks provide tasty, nutritious meals for a very low cost.

Fees cover rent, all meals and light housekeeping. Additional personal support services available. Specific eligibility criteria related to finances and care needs will be determined through an application and assessment process.


Paul's NOFRILLS "Eat Together" event supports Wendat Community Programs

Mental Health Awareness Week October 6 – 12, 2019

Who is affected by mental illness?

- Mental illness indirectly affects all Canadians at some time through a family member, friend or colleague.
- In any given year, 1 in 5 people in Canada will personally experience a mental health problem or illness.
- Mental illness affects people of all ages, education, income levels, and cultures.
- Approximately 8% of adults will experience major depression at some time in their lives.
- About 1% of Canadians will experience bipolar disorder (or "manic depression").

How common is it?

- By age 40, about 50% of the population will have or have had a mental illness.
- Schizophrenia affects 1% of the Canadian population.
- Anxiety disorders affect 5% of the household population, causing mild to severe impairment.
- Suicide accounts for 24% of all deaths among 15-24 year olds and 16% among 25-44 year olds.
- Suicide is one of the leading causes of death in both men and women from adolescence to middle age.
- The mortality rate due to suicide among men is four times the rate among women.
