North Simcoe Ontario Health Team Progress Report

Over the past several months, our partnership - GBGH, Chigamik, North Simcoe Family Health Team and Wendat Community Programs - has been working diligently to establish the groundwork and develop an initial plan to create the North Simcoe Ontario Health Team (NSOHT).

On December 4, we submitted our Self-Assessment to become the NSOHT as part of Round 2 submissions with the Ministry of Health.

As part of the submission, we explained the rationale for the formal alliance partners involved, as well as:

- Assessed our ability to provide patient-centred care and engage our community
- Defined our Year 1 patient population complex and frail seniors
- Outlined potential services
- Explained some initial plans for leadership, governance, performance measurement, quality improvement and funding
- Plan an initial digital health strategy
- Provided an implementation snapshot of Year 1

In preparation for our Self-Assessment submission, we engaged with members of the North Simcoe Sub-Region Planning Table, elected officials, First Nation Métis Inuit (FNMI), nurse practitioners and physicians.

If our Self-Assessment is accepted, we will move on to the next stage in the process – the full application. This will require detailed information about our population, team, transformation, collaboration, continuous learning, quality improvement, risk analysis, home & community care and digital health.

Although we have not yet heard the outcome of our Self-Assessment, we know the full application will be due to the Ministry within only a few months of receiving approval to proceed. Until we have approval, our core group of partners and affiliates continue to meet in preparation.

No one likes to think about it, but appropriate, affordable housing for seniors is an issue in North Simcoe.



"In 2015, population estimates showed that Canada had more people aged 65 and older than children aged 0 to 14", reported Statistics Canada, September 2017. "According to the most recent demographic projections, one in five Canadians should be aged 65 and older in 2024", from Statistics Canada, January 2019.

In Midland, Penetanguishene, Tiny and Tay (North Simcoe), our population includes a high number of seniors. "By 2041, the population of seniors 65 years and older in Simcoe Muskoka is projected to surpass 218,800, which is more than double the number of seniors from 2011 (Simcoe Muskoka District Health Unit, 2016 Census Data)."

Many seniors in our region live alone and face significant challenges. They face difficulty with outdoor and indoor maintenance of their homes, using stairs, cleaning, shopping, laundry, bathing and cooking. Limited assistance with the activities of daily living may be available to some, if they qualify. Private services are available but not necessarily affordable for all.

Most do not consider moving until health issues or other life events force them to make a decision. When moving becomes necessary, the options are limited. While our region offers some beautiful private retirement homes, this is not an affordable option for many seniors. Not everyone is eligible for long term care and even if they are, the wait lists are long.

There is definitely a need for a housing option for low income seniors in North Simcoe. Wendat has been offering services for seniors since 2007. In 2016, Wendat Community Programs opened the Lorna Tomlinson Residence for Seniors.

It is the only truly affordable option for frail seniors in this community. This facility, located in Penetanguishene houses frail, low income seniors who are not eligible for Long Term Care and can't afford a private retirement home. The Lorna Tomlinson Residence is also the home for Wendat's Senior's Day Program and the Congregate Dining Program.

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Located at 44 Dufferin Street in Penetanguishene, the residence provides supportive housing for 23 frail, low income seniors. Each room has a private bathroom. Meals and snacks in a dining room, laundry service, light housekeeping, common spaces for socializing, an enclosed courtyard and access to assisted living services for those needing personal support is included. There are two rooms that can accommodate couples. All this is provided for a little over \$1,000/month per person. This beautiful facility is fully accessible, built all on one floor.

Wendat needs your help to ensure that no senior citizen in our community needs to worry about being a burden on our healthcare system, their families or suffer from loneliness. Although we raised most of the funds to build this facility, we are working hard to pay off the remaining construction costs and plan for future expansion. Ontario REALTORS Care Foundation gives \$2,766 to Wendat Community Programs

Ontario REALTORS Care Foundation has granted Wendat Community Programs \$2,766 to go towards 2019/2020 operating costs at the Lorna Tomlinson Residence for Seniors.

The Lorna Tomlinson Residence for Seniors operated by Wendat Community Programs, is the only truly affordable option for frail seniors in the North Simcoe community. This 23 bed facility, located in Penetanguishene houses frail, low income seniors who are not eligible for Long Term Care and can't afford a private retirement home. This facility provides affordable housing, 3 meals a day, assisted living services and a senior's day program to the residents living there as well as seniors living on their own in the community.

Rotary Club of Penetanguishene Donates to Wendat

Rotary of Penetanguishene donated \$2,000 to assist up to forty clients of Wendat's Support for Independent Living Program to obtain or replace birth certificates or other forms of ID. This program assists persons with serious mental illness and high support needs, to live as independently as possible with in-home case management support.

Most of the clients in this program live on low income and can't afford unexpected expenses. Each year, several clients need to obtain or replace lost ID such as birth certificates or photo ID cards and there is a charge for this. This identification is needed to obtain benefits, seek medical help, rent housing etc.
